Pride Journey: Athens, Georgia

Everyone knows that I am a sucker for small-city charm, so I decided to venture about an hour and a half outside of Atlanta to Athens, Georgia, home of rock bands R.E.M., Widespread Panic, and of course, the B-52's. As soon as I drove into the college town, I knew I was in for a treat. I love exploring these destinations as they tend to offer tons of local restaurants and boutiques which ooze with character.

Athens is a thriving college town located in the northeastern part of Georgia. It is home to the University of Georgia, which is the state's flagship university, as well as the Athens Institute of Technology and Piedmont College. Athens is a vibrant city that offers a unique blend of Southern charm and culture.

Athens has a rich history that dates back to the early 1800s when it was founded as the seat of Clarke County. The city was first settled in 1801 and was named after Athens, Greece, the birthplace of democracy. The city played a key role in the Civil War, serving as a transportation hub for the Confederacy. In the years following the war, Athens became a center of higher education, with the founding of the University of Georgia.

The city soon became the center of politics and commerce in the region. The University of Georgia is the largest employer in Athens, and its presence has shaped the city's culture and economy. The university is home to the Georgia Bulldogs, the school's football team, and a number of other athletic teams. It also hosts numerous music, art, and theater events throughout the year.

Athens is also known for its distinctive neighborhoods. Five Points is the city's oldest and most popular area, and is home to a variety of shops, restaurants, and

After checking into my room at Hotel Indigo, I walked to the center of town, which was lined with a large selection of restaurants and live music venues. Given the musical heritage of Athens, live music is still at the heart of their nightlife scene. Some venues worth checking out include 40 Watt Club, The Warehouse, and the Georgia Theatre.

To my surprise, located in the center of downtown is a fabulous four-way rainbow crosswalk. Sometimes when I visit smaller destinations, I wonder if the community is welcoming to LGBTQ individuals, but I quickly realized that Athens most definitely is. Having the university present in the city adds to its progressive stance. If you are in

town on a Friday evening, swing by Athens Showgirl Cabaret's Fabulous Fridays at Hendershot's, located in the Bottleworks development. A coffee shop during the day and bar in the evening, Hendershot's is the perfect place to mingle among LGBTQ locals. After the drag show, head to Sister Louisa's Church, about a 10-minute walk from Hendershot's. The quirky establishment features a bar, patio, and club area and is the hub of LGBTQ nightlife in Athens.

After a restful night's sleep, head to Mama's Boy, for breakfast. A short drive from the hotel, the restaurant is a local institution, serving up a hearty breakfast that won't break the budget. The morning is a great time to head to

from Hotel Indigo, although I would recommend bringing a bottle of water along for the journey. The museum contains a lovely sculpture garden as well as various exhibition halls which feature a vast collection of fine art. Currently on exhibition is Power & Piety: Seventeenth-Century Spanish Art. Admission is free to



both the Museum of Art as well as the botanical gardens, making Athens a budget-friendly getaway.

Speaking of art, beautiful murals can be found all over town, depicting the city's rich musical heritage, but my favorite was the "Greetings from Athens" mural located on the side of a building in a

narrow alley. It can easily be missed if you don't know where you are going.

The city is home to numerous festivals, including the AthFest Music and Arts Festival, the Athens Film Festival, and the Athens International Film & Video Festival, so it may be a good idea to plan

your visit around one of those events

If you are in the mood to do some shopping, I recommend wandering through Wuxtry Records, one of a few independently owned record stores left in the country. I could spend hours going through their endless aisles of records but only had two days in the city, so I had to move on. I stumbled upon Community, a hub for locally-made products including candles and handcrafted soaps.

Athens, Georgia is a small city with a lot to offer. Its vibrant music scene, thriving culinary scene, and abundance of outdoor recreation opportunities make it a perfect destination for a solo trip or a vacation with friends. If you are looking for a hip weekend adventure, I would give Athens a try.

- Resistant HBV. Your healthcare provider will test you for HBV infection before you start treatment with DOVATO. If you have HIV-1 and hepatitis B, the HBV can change (mutate) during your treatment with DOVATO and become harder to treat (resistant). It is not known if DOVATO is safe and effective in people who have HIV-1 and HBV infection.
- Worsening of HBV infection. If you have HBV infection and take DOVATO, your HBV may get worse (flare-up) if you stop taking DOVATO. A "flare-up" is when your HBV infection suddenly returns in a worse way than before.
 - Do not run out of DOVATO. Refill your prescription or talk to your healthcare provider before your DOVATO is all gone.

What is DOVATO?

DOVATO is a prescription medicine that is used without other HIV-1 medicines to treat human immunodeficiency virus-1 (HIV-1) infection in adults: who have not received HIV-1 medicines in the past, or to replace their current HIV-1 medicines when their healthcare provider determines that they meet certain requirements. HIV-1 is the virus that causes Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome (AIDS). It is not known if DOVATO is safe and effective in children.

Important Facts About DOVATO (cont'd)

Who should not take DOVATO?

Do not take DOVATO if you:

- have ever had an allergic reaction to a medicine that contains dolutegravir or lamivudine.
- take dofetilide. Taking DOVATO and dofetilide can cause side effects that may be serious or life-threatening.

What should I tell my healthcare provider before using DOVATO?

Tell your healthcare provider about all of your medical conditions, including if you:

- have or have had liver problems, including hepatitis B or C infection.
- have kidney problems.

 are pregnant or plan to become pregnant. One of the medicines in DOVATO (dolutegravir) may harm your unborn baby.

 Your healthcare provider may prescribe a different medicine than DOVATO if you are planning to become pregnant or if pregnancy is confirmed during the first 12 weeks of pregnancy.

 If you can become pregnant, your healthcare provider may perform a pregnancy test before you start treatment with DOVATO.

 If you can become pregnant, you and your healthcare provider should talk about the use of effective birth control (contraception) during treatment with DOVATO.

 Tell your healthcare provider right away if you are planning to become pregnant, you become pregnant, or think you may be pregnant during treatment with DOVATO.

are breastfeeding or plan to breastfeed. Do not breastfeed if you take DOVATO.

 You should not breastfeed if you have HIV-1 because of the risk of passing HIV-1 to your baby.

DOVATO passes to your baby in your breast milk.

Talk with your healthcare provider about the best way to feed your baby.

Tell your healthcare provider about all the medicines you take, including prescription and over-the-counter medicines, vitamins, and herbal supplements.

Some medicines interact with DOVATO. Keep a list of your medicines and show it to your healthcare provider and pharmacist when you get a new medicine.

- You can ask your healthcare provider or pharmacist for a list of medicines that interact with DOVATO.
- Do not start taking a new medicine without telling your healthcare provider. Your healthcare provider can tell you if it is safe to take DOVATO with other medicines.

What are possible side effects of DOVATO? (cont'd)

- Allergic reactions. Call your healthcare provider right away if you develop a rash with DOVATO. Stop taking DOVATO and get medical help right away if you develop a rash with any of the following signs or symptoms: fever; generally ill feeling; tiredness; muscle or joint aches; blisters or sores in mouth; blisters or peeling of the skin; redness or swelling of the eyes; swelling of the mouth, face, lips, or tongue; problems breathing.
- Liver problems. People with a history of hepatitis B or C virus may have an increased risk of developing new or worsening changes in certain liver tests during treatment with DOVATO. Liver problems, including liver failure, have also happened in people without a history of liver disease or other risk factors. Your healthcare provider may do blood tests to check your liver. Tell your healthcare provider right away if you get any of the following signs or symptoms of liver problems: your skin or the white part of your eyes turns yellow (jaundice); dark or "tea-colored" urine; light-colored stools (bowel movements); nausea or vomiting; loss of appetite; and/or pain, aching, or tenderness on the right side of your stomach area.
- Too much lactic acid in your blood (lactic acidosis). Too much lactic acid is a serious medical emergency that can lead to death. Tell your healthcare provider right away if you get any of the following symptoms that could be signs of lactic acidosis: feel very weak or tired; unusual (not normal) muscle pain; trouble breathing; stomach pain with nausea and vomiting; feel cold, especially in your arms and legs; feel dizzy or lightheaded; and/or a fast or irregular heartbeat.
- Lactic acidosis can also lead to severe liver problems, which can lead to death. Your liver may become large (hepatomegaly) and you may develop fat in your liver (steatosis). Tell your healthcare provider right away if you get any of the signs or symptoms of liver problems which are listed above under "Liver problems."
- You may be more likely to get lactic acidosis or severe liver problems if you are female or very overweight (obese).
- Changes in your immune system (Immune Reconstitution Syndrome) can happen when you start taking HIV-1 medicines. Your immune system may get stronger and begin to fight infections that have been hidden in your body for a long time. Tell your healthcare provider right away if you start having new symptoms after you start taking DOVATO.
 The most common side effects of DOVATO include: headache;
- The most common side effects of DOVATO include: headache nausea; diarrhea; trouble sleeping; tiredness; and anxiety.



Hannah Gadsby Thinks You Deserve a Break

A lot has changed since Hannah Gadsby first took audiences on the unexpected journey that was "Nanette," their 2018 career-making Netflix special. Yes, there was that whole Trump presidency situation and, oh, that global pandemic hiccup, but also, Gadsby got new glasses, an additional dog, created two more specials, put out a New York Times bestselling memoir ("Ten Steps to Nanette"), opened an art show in Brooklyn focused on Picasso's alleged misogyny ("It's Pablo-matic: Picasso According to Hannah Gadsby"), and picked up a new descriptor along the way: beloved wife.

It's that latter detail that Gadsby explores in depth in their latest Netflix endeavor, "Something Special." Spoiler alert: A wild rabbit pays the ultimate price for Gadsby's wedded bliss, but it's totally not the rabbit's fault. It's just that, sometimes, the journey is exactly the opposite of what you're expecting, and maybe that's the point of, well, everything.

The newly released special is a departure from Gadsby's work on stage so far, which has focused on topics like neurodivergency (Gadsby is autistic), family dysfunction, mental health and other heavy topics. The comedian teases the audience that all the chatter about how this special would be more lighthearted than "Nanette" and "Douglas," released in 2020, could be an elaborate ruse. Is existentialism and social reckoning right around the corner? Nah. Gadsby, as they remind us in example after example, is not a good liar.

This special, like the others, is about where Gadsby is at this moment in time. And, happily, this moment is a good one.

"I didn't expect to get married," Gadsby tells Pride Source in a recent Zoom interview. "So I thought that was an interesting enough place to begin. Also, I believe my audience has invested in me. I shared my pain and my trauma and my difficulties, and I think it would be weird to hide

my current state of joy. That would feel like a disingenuous approach. So I really wanted to share that." Gadsby's marriage to producer Jenney Shamash, who the comedian calls "Jenno," has been surprising in one way, the comedian says. "Being surrounded by straight, unhappy married people my whole life, I'm mostly surprised that it's not so miserable. Like, you hear comedians talk about it: 'My wife's this. My wife's that.' Why did you marry that horrible person you keep complaining about?" they joke. Gadsby says that as they toured with the new material, audiences responded in a way that made it clear this was a show they wanted and, in many ways, needed. "It's going to be a feel-good show because I believe I owe you one," they say in the special. "I have dragged you through a bit of my shit over the years, and you've stuck with me. Much obliged! But it's time for some payoff."

Still, Gadsby is happy to dig into the heavy stuff during our time

together, acknowledging the deeply disturbing culture wars happening in the U.S. with the LGBTQ+ community at the center — especially LGBTQ+ kids and young adults. "I was a young person during a very similar time, but without the internet — so it wasn't that similar," Gadsby says. "But the anti-gay rhetoric that I grew up with — the discourse surrounding me when I was growing up — was frighteningly similar to that which we're experiencing now."

Coming of age in tiny Tasmania, an Australian island state some 150 miles south of the mainland, Gadsby said they felt isolated, a struggle in and of itself. But today's younger generation is experiencing an anti-LGBTQ+ sentiment "everywhere all at once."

"So it's incredibly difficult, particularly, to be a young queer person in this moment," they add. "And I can't speak to that experience. I'm not queer... That is a joke. I'm not young. But, I wanted to lead with the fact that I've overcome the trauma of this kind of environment."

queer sentiment. "Part of the rage in 'Nanette' was the fact that we don't learn," they say. "Why aren't we learning? Why can't we learn? And I still have that rage. There's still a fight to be fought, but there'll be time for that. I just felt like we need a break also because we're fighting for our right to exist." Gadsby notes that people trying to oppress the queer community don't actually have skin in the game. "They're not going home and wondering if they'll be safe. They're already safe. That's what we have to remember as a community. It's like we have to look after ourselves and

is experiencing a new wave of anti-

Looking after each other can be challenging for people experiencing trauma — the tendency can be to retreat into isolation. "Yeah, that's what trauma does," Gadsby says. "And what's going on at the moment is incredibly traumatic. In many ways, Gadsby's presence on stage is a billboard for intersectionality. They are frank about their identity as a genderqueer lesbian and their 2017 autism diagnosis, aspects of Gadsby's personhood that has made it challenging for the entertainment world to figure out where they belong.

"Before I even began my career, I was difficult to categorize my entire life, and not for a lack of trying," Gadsby says. "But I think that's where my comedy begins — it's me trying to be what people would prefer I be, and my persistent failure is what has gotten me here. I think I'm... close. I'm always close, but just always fall short. But I think that's where comedy lives, so it's not a problem."

Neurodiversity has been a central topic in all three Netflix specials. "And I'm really keen not to tell autism, and rather to show it. That's what this show really is. It's showing autism."

At one point in "Something Special," Gadsby recounts two separate stories involving awkward encounters with Jodie Foster. In

Oh, "Boy": An interview with queer singer/ songwriter Jordy

Out singer/songwriter Jordy is on a career high. After gaining national attention via appearances on the "Today Show" and "Good Morning America," as well as becoming a TikTok sensation, playing a series of music festivals, and releasing his debut album in 2021, Jordy's back with his sophomore full-length "Boy" (300 Elektra Entertainment). Just in time for summer (and Pride), Jordy's brand of honest and uplifting queer pop is just what we need at this difficult time for the LGBTQ+ community. Jordy made time for a quick interview at the start of Pride season.

Gregg Shapiro: Jordy, the last time we spoke, in April 2021, some incredible career events had just occurred for you. You signed with 300 Entertainment (now 300 Elektra Entertainment), you performed on the "Today Show," and your song "Long Distance" had become a breakout hit. When you look back on that time, what stands out the most to you?

Jordy: It was such a crazy time for me. I had been putting out music for years, but all of a sudden, things were happening so incredibly quickly. I think it was a good reminder from the universe that I was doing all the right things – writing music that was honest and authentic to me and sharing it with the world. I'm so grateful for that time in my life. It was such a stepping-stone.


GS: Two years later, do you feel like you've had the chance to fully absorb the events of the recent past?

Jordy: I try every day to live as presently as possible. I think it's so easy to forget to celebrate the victories along the way because we, as artists, are always thinking about what's coming next. But when I think about what l've accomplished over the years it makes me emotional. I'm

doing what I've always dreamed of doing, and there's not a day that goes by when I don't think about how grateful I am for that.

GS: You went to college in Boston, as I did (Emerson College), and I was wondering if you were able to take advantage of the city's renowned music scene while you lived there.

Jordy: I was an a cappella boy [laughs]. At BU, I was a member of the "treblemakers" and I truly have the fondest memories. I learned how to perform, how to sing in more of a pop lane after being classically trained in high school and made friends that will be my friends forever. Eventually, I started writing a bit and gigged around Boston and Cambridge which was really fun for



GS: Me, too! This interview is taking place while you're in Europe, where last night you performed at the Night & Day Café in Manchester, England.

Jordy: It's all just so crazy. Playing

Birmingham and London already, it's been insane to see the turnout and the amount of people screaming the lyrics back at me. I get so stuck in my bubble of L.A. that I forget the music is being listened to by people all over the world. It's so cool, and also fun to hear people singing my songs with a different accent [laughs]. I cannot wait to come back.

was the best part of the experience of making "Boy" for you?

Jordy: Honestly, working with my best friends. I feel so lucky to work with stupidly talented people, but even luckier that they are the people I love the absolute most. Some who have been with me since my very first single. It's so special. It was also a very cathartic experience writing about my life over the past couple of years. Growing up is so hard and being able to write about that in the music was so therapeutic. I am immensely proud of the project and so happy it's out for people to enjoy.

GS: At a time when the subject of mental health is a large part of the national conversation, some of the songs on "Boy," including "Good Not Great," "Boy (Intro)," "Hypothetical Party," "Dry Spell," "Love You and Let You Go," sound like you being honest about your own struggles. What do you hope to achieve by sharing songs such as these?

Jordy: I think when I was young, I just wanted to feel heard and seen. I was closeted and insecure and so emotional in a time when it wasn't "cool" for boys to express that. When I write music, I want my listeners to feel seen in the way I wasn't. All those songs express very true parts of myself, and I wanted to be as vulnerable as possible so that my fans felt less alone after listening to the record. We're all human. And we deserve to experience art that honestly represents our journeys.

GS: "Story of a Boy," includes your queer interpolation of Nine Days "Story of a Girl," but the song has had a bonus as it has become a kind of anthem for the trans community. What does that mean to you?

Jordy: It's been such a humbling and emotional experience for me. The trans community is under attack right now. They need their voices lifted. They need protection. So, for



this trend to happen organically during this time is incredibly powerful. At first, I thought it was cool that I was taking the original song and making it my own, which is the gay experience, but now it's taken on a whole other meaning. Meeting trans fans at shows and hearing how much the song means to them is why I do what I do. Tell your trans friends you love them. They need it.

GS: "luv u, bye" is a hot dance track that sounds like it could be a hit at tea dances. How would you feel if the song was embraced by DJs and became a club hit?

Jordy: I would love that! Let's make it happen [laughs].

GS: You're playing some upcoming Pride festivals, including ones in West Hollywood, Houston, and Chicago. As a native of the Chicago area, what does it mean to you to be performing for the hometown crowd?

Jordy: Every time I get a chance to perform in Chicago, it warms my entire heart. That city is my home and my heart. And to be representing my city and the queer community all at the same time is truly a dream come true. Pride can't come soon enough!

GS: When you perform in a state such as Texas, where the LGBTQ+community is under threat, do you feel a responsibility to use your platform as an artist to speak out against injustice?

Jordy: Absolutely. Every show in those states is an act of protest. I will sing every song proudly and speak on behalf of my community without fear. We need to be loud. We need to speak up. And I am honored to do that for my community. It's my duty as an artist.



GRAB LUCINDA

Heart and humor and humility: An interview with Lucinda Williams

In a recording career that spans more than 40 years, with well over a dozen studio albums of unforgettable originals, Grammy Awardwinner Lucinda Williams has left an indelible mark on contemporary Americana, country, blues, pop, and rock music. Virtually unstoppable undeterred by a tornado, a stroke, and a pandemic - Williams emerges victorious on record and in print in 2023. Her memoir, "Don't Tell Anybody the Secrets I Told You" (Crown), was recently published, and her new album "Stories From A Rock N Roll Heart" (Highway 20/Thirty Tigers), featuring a stellar lineup of guest artists including Angel Olsen, Bruce Springsteen, and Margo Price, arrives this summer. An absolute delight to talk to, Lucinda was gracious enough to make time for an interview before the release of the album.

Gregg Shapiro: 2023 is the 35th anniversary of your self-titled album which contained the song "Passionate Kisses," later covered by Mary Chapin Carpenter, earning you your first Grammy Award. What was the experience of having one of your songs become a hit for another singer, and what did it mean to you win that Grammy? Lucinda Williams: It was great, of course. Having Chapin – that's what her friends call her - cover "Passionate Kisses" opened a big door for me, really. It started getting all this airplay and eventually won a Grammy for Country Song of the Year, which was the biggest irony, because it almost didn't become the single. She wanted it to be the first single off her new album and her people said no, they didn't think it was a good idea because it wasn't a

country song.

GS: It was more pop. LW: Yeah, but she stuck to her guns and said, "I don't care." She had been playing it live and she said her fans really liked the song a lot. She stood her ground and said she wanted it to

be the first single. They relented and it became the single. When it won the Grammy for Country Song of the Year [laughs] it was nice. It was like, "Ha ha ha."

GS: You got the last laugh. LW: Exactly!

GS: Over the years, you've had a wonderful array of guest musicians performing with you on your albums, and "Stories From A Rock N Roll Heart" is no exception, beginning with Bruce Springsteen and Patti Scialfa on "New York Comeback" and "Rock N Roll Heart." What made those songs a good fit for you, Bruce and Patti?

LW: I think the nature of the songs, what they're about, and just the feel and vibe of them. I'm in Nashville right now with my husband Tom, and our friend Jesse Malin was in town. We were working on songs

together. That one came up, and I think it was Tom who had the feeling - he's always been a huge Bruce fan, and he said, "Wouldn't it be great if we could have Bruce on this song." At first, it was just Bruce, and then Patti jumped in, bless her heart. Anyway, Jesse Malin was the one who piped up and said, "I think I can get I can get a hold of Bruce for you. He'd probably be into it. Jesse went back home to New York where he lives. He's tied in with all the Fast Coast rockers and musicians and all. So, he was able to track Bruce down. Bruce said yes. We sent him the tracks; we weren't in the studio with him at the same time. Bruce has his own studio. They went in and jumped on board. We didn't even tell him what to do. We let them decide for themselves. They ended up really getting into it enthusiastically. You can tell when you listen. Every time I





I hear it and I hear his voice on there I just get so excited and happy. It's such a thrill to hear him on there. He's just such a sweetheart.

GS: Another one of the stellar quest artists on the album is queer singer/songwriter Angel Olsen who joins you on "Jukebox." Why did you want to work with her?


LW: I love her voice and her vibe and everything. I wanted another voice on there. I love having guests come in the studio and do their thing. It adds so much to the song. A lot of the time it has to do with if the person is available and how convenient is it going to be and all those technical details. She happened to be in Nashville around the time we were in the studio. I think she told me she spends a lot of time in Asheville, North Carolina. But she was in Nashville, and she was really into coming in and doing something. That's how all that happened. That went smoothly. She just came in and did her thing. It's real subtle, but I think it really adds something, especially at the end

GS: I live in Fort Lauderdale, and you live in Nashville, meaning that we both in live places considered to be ground zero for attacks on the LGBTQ+ community. To my ears, it sounds like you are addressing that subject on the song "This Is Not My City." Am I right about that?

LW: I wasn't necessarily but, it's open for interpretation. I'm glad you mentioned that actually because I like to politicize things. I like to make statements about things. That was one that was a collaboration, a collaborative effort between me and my husband Tom and Travis Stephens. I know Tom and I talked about this. It is politicized, but it might not be real obvious. You're right, basically, it is supposed to be about that feeling of division. Being politically divided and being frustrated with it. Just all the stuff that's been going for the last however many years.

GS: Are you aware of if you have an LGBTQ+ following for your work?

LW: I hope so! It's hard for me to tell.



Somebody would need to have been keeping track of all that. I mean, the only thing I could do is look out in the audience or, after the show, meet and greet people. But there's always been a certain percentage of my audience from that community. I'm not sure if there's more now or not. It would be cool if there were [laughs].

GS: I also want to extend my congratulations on the publication of your memoir "Don't Tell Anybody the Secrets I Told You." As the daughter of a writer, poet Miller Williams, do you think it was inevitable that you would someday write a book?

LW: Yeah, probably. For years, people have been saying I should write a book. I'm such a storvteller. I've always written songs that tell stories. When I get on stage to perform my songs, I explain the song by telling the story behind the song. The book is really just the same thing, just taking it a little bit deeper even. With more details about the characters and the songs because they're all true stories. I talk a lot about characters that people already know about through the

songs. When they read the book, they can get to know them even better, maybe see a photograph of them in the book.

GS: You have concert tour dates from May through August. I was thinking about the way that when Mary Gauthier published her memoir, and she would tour, she would read passages from the book and then do songs. Will you be doing something similar? Reading passages from "Don't Tell Anybody the Secrets I Told You" in your concerts?

LW: Yeah, we're going to do something like that. The lyrics to a lot of the songs are in the book. After the story, there'll be some lyrics from a song that is connected with that story. Tom was saying he wants to connect some recordings of songs with the book. Make a CD of songs that go with the book, have it available with the book, or something like that.

GS: If "Don't Tell Anybody the Secrets I Told You" was adapted into a biopic, who would you want



to play you?

LW: That's so interesting because I just did a book event with Steve Earle as the moderator in a bookstore in Brooklyn, when we were in New York recently, and somebody said that (Williams' acclaimed 1998 album) "Car Wheels on A Gravel Road" should be made into a play.

GS: Wow! Like a musical?


LW: Yes, I guess. Then I kind of laughed and said, "Okay, as long as Frances McDormand can play me." Everybody clapped [laughs]. I love her! It was just off the top of my head, basically. But I've always loved her acting. She kind of reminds me of me a little bit, physically. I think she would be a good choice.

GS: My husband turned 70 in March, and to celebrate we went for dim sum with a group of friends. Did you do anything special to commemorate your 70th birthday?

LW: Let's see, I think we were performing somewhere. It was January 26th, so we would have been in Europe. We did the show and they brought a cake out on stage for me. The audience sang "Happy Birthday" [laughs]. It was a trip turning 70! I wanted to tell everybody, "I'm 70! I'm 70!"

GS: It's something to celebrate.

LW: Yeah, I made it to 70. Nobody thinks I'm 70 [laughs].

"I Have Something to Tell You (For Young Adults) By Chasten Buttigiegec.c.2023, Simon & Schuster Children's Publishing \$18.99 209 pages



Experience, they say, is the best teacher.

Once you've done something, you can say you like it and you'll do it again or not. The subject comes with a different viewpoint, once you've gotten a little experience with it. You're wiser, more confident. As in the new book "I Have Something to Tell You" by Chasten Buttigieg, you'll have the chops to offer valid advice.

If you'd have asked 8-year-old Chasten Buttigieg what life was like, he probably would've told you about his big brothers and how wild and daring they were. He would've said he didn't have many friends and that he loved his parents. He wouldn't have told you about being gay, though, because he had no frame of reference, no experience, or role models. He just knew then that he was "different."

A year later, he watched Will & Grace on TV for the first time, and it was hilarious but he had to be careful. Already, he understood that being "someone 'like that'" had to be hidden. He watched Ellen and he was sure that "gay people weren't found in places" like his Northern Michigan home town.

For much of his childhood,
Buttigieg says he was bullied, but
being lonely was worse. He was
awkward, but he found his happy place
in theater. "In school," he says, "I felt a
constant tug-of-war between where I
was and where I wanted to be,"
between authenticity and pretending. A
year as a high school senior exchange
student in gay-friendly Germany, then a
"safe space" in college in Wisconsin
clarified many things and helped him
gain confidence and "broaden [his]
perspective."

By the time he met the man he calls Peter, "I felt at ease to present myself in ways I hadn't felt comfortable doing..."

A BOOK

Still, he says, things may be better or they may be worse, "We've got a long way to go, but you, the reader, get to be a part of that promising future."

Filled with an abundance of dad jokes and a casual, chatty tone that never once feels pushy or overbearing, "I Have Something to Tell You" may seem like deja vu for good reason. This gently altered version of a 2020 memoir, meant for kids ages 12 and up, says all the right things in a surprisingly paternal way.

And yet, none of it's preachy, or even stern.

Though there are brief peeks at his adult life on the campaign trail with his husband, now-Secretary of Transportation Pete Buttigieg, the heart of author Chasten Buttigieg's book is all memoir, set in a loving household in a small town. It's lightly humorous but not trite; to this, Buttigieg adds a layer of subtle advice, and genuineness to a tale that's familiar to adults and will appeal to young, still-figuring-it-out teens.

You can expect a "you are not alone" message in a book like this, but it comes with an upbeat, fatherly calm. For a teen who needs that, reading "I Have Something to Tell You" will be a good experience.

"Harley Quinn: Ravenous" by Rachael Allen c.2023, Random House \$19.99 349 pages

Put it out of your mind, don't worry about it. It's likely nothing, so let it rest. Let it go and don't be afraid because, as in the new book "Harley Quinn: Ravenous" by Rachael Allen, fear is how they make you scream.

Being a First Year intern at Gotham University was going to be The. Best.

Having completed the University's gap-year program last year, Harleen Quinzel was practically bouncing. She'd decided on research, possibly

psychology, as a career and First Year program included mentorship and a chance to study some of Gotham's worst, most notorious criminal minds. The Joker, Two-Face, King Shark, Mr. Freeze, she could be assigned to any one of them at Arkham Asylum.

First Year was also going to be a bit of a relief.

Sure, she'd still have to put up with classmates like the jerk who kept asking if she was "straight now" (nope, still bi, today, tomorrow, last week) and she'd have to try to fit in, which was hard to do after what happened at the end of last year. Then, some of Harleen's friends were attacked with a fear spray that made them scream and scream, and her best friend died from it. There was gossip but Harleen had her research to enjoy, she loved her mentor, and she was fascinated by Talia al Ghul, who'd tried to assassinate Gotham's mayor. Talia was a great study-subject - even though Harleen wasn't technically supposed to ever speak to her.

Until Talia said that she knew who made the fear spray. She needed information for information, tit for tat, and she hinted that she knew the truth about Straw Man, who was rumored to haunt Arkham and who had a hand in the fear spray, so...

So then Harleen woke up in the hospital, the victim of a bad accident and amnesia. But was it an accident? Were this guy, Win, and the adorable lvy trustworthy? And the escape of Gotham City's worst, most violent criminals... was Harleen at fault?

Let's say a movie theatre mushed its film to a pulp and made a novel from the leftover cells. Or they used the mush to paint a Ben-Dot artwork panel, but in words. That's kinda how you could think of this book. As a part of the "DC Icons" franchise, "Harley Quinn: Ravenous" almost screams graphic novel or comic book. So what's the problem?

Nothing, as long as you know that before you pick it up because that's the sort of feel you'll get in what only looks like a regular novel. Nothing, if you relish a story that starts with action and peppers it with chaos before dropping readers into a land of dark monsters and crime. Nothing at all, if you've read author Rachael Allen's novel-before-

this-one – otherwise, you'll be awash in humor, feminism, superheroes, and scrambling to find your footing. Be warned.

Overall, love a funny, crazy-paced dark-Gotham novel with a feminist warrior, you'll devour "Harley Quinn: Ravenous." As for a bookmark...? Nah, forget about it.
