

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

Forever Young: an interview with Grammy Award winner Tracy Young

If you've been dancing in a club any time in the last 20 or so years, chances are very good that you've hit the crowded dancefloor to a remix by Grammy Award-winning lesbian DJ and producer Tracy Young. The mid-Atlantic native and Miami resident has left her distinctive mark on songs by Pet Shop Boys, Cyndi Lauper. P!nk, Shakira, Lady Gaga, Gloria Estefan, Cher, Beyoncé, Demi Lovato, Stevie Nicks, Katy Perry, Chaka Khan, Christina Aguilera, and most significantly, Madonna. In fact, it was a Madonna tune, "I Rise" from 2019's Madame X, that earned Young her Best Remixed Recording, Non-Classical Grammy Award in January 2020, making her the first female producer to ever win the category. Busier than ever, Young was

gracious enough to answer a few questions shortly after the Grammys.

Gregg Shapiro: Tracy, I'd like to begin by congratulating you on your January 2020 Grammy Award win for Best Remixed Recording, Non-Classical. What does being the recipient of such an award mean to you?

Tracy Young: Thank you so much, Gregg! I am still on a cloud from last Sunday's historical Grammy win. I was just starting to feel comfortable with being nominated after 25-years in the business...and then I won!! It means everything to me.

GS: Please say something about the significance of being the first woman

to win the Grammy Award for Best Remixed Recording, Non-Classical. **TY:** Despite being eligible in previous years, the "Best Remixed Recording, Non-Classical category was just introduced to the Recording Academy in 1998 and it's taken this long for a woman to be nominated. Now in 2020, both the industry and my peers are starting to see the hard work that goes into this business regardless of gender. My hope is that my Grammy win will create a dialogue and platform in the industry to recognize more female producers who have been overlooked for so long.

GS: Do you have a special place picked out to display your Grammy Award?







TY: I do but it's top secret and only my dog Lucca knows [laughs].

GS: Did you hear from Madonna, whose song "I Rise" was the one you remixed, after you won?

TY: Well, of course I texted Madonna, because she's been somebody that I've not only aspired to be like as far as being an artist – she's always pushing the envelope and growing and learning. She texted back right away saying, "Congratulations!" with a bunch of emojis. She's happy. She's super proud. She's been an amazing support and has given me a lot of opportunities over many years.

GS: I first interviewed you in 2000 for Next Magazine. The title of the piece was "If Madonna Calls..." Here we are 20 years later, and you still have a significant working relationship with Madonna. What makes it such a long-lasting creative partnership? **TY:** Trust is paramount whenever you are collaborating and that is the one thing that Madonna has always given me. She trusts the creative process and is very instrumental in guiding me forward. Our "I Rise" collaboration marks a high point in our long working relationship and I couldn't be prouder to share this award with Madonna.

GS: The first time we spoke 20 years ago I was living in Chicago, birthplace of house music, and you said you hadn't spun there yet. Have you had a chance to spin in Chicago since then, and if so, what do you like best about the Chicago club scene?

TY: I love Chicago! I've played at Hydrate over the years and know that the boys there love their music, so I'm always prepared.

GS: From the very early days of disco to the present day, dance music has

been a central component of LGBTQ+ culture. As an out person, can you please say something about how you see your place in LGBTQ+ history?

TY: Beyond the music that I've either produced or created, I hope to be remembered for my philanthropic support and fundraising efforts that give back to various LGBTQ+ charities such as GLAAD, GMHC, Elton John AIDS Foundation, The National Gav and Lesbian Task Force. The Trevor Project, It Gets Better, Diversity Honors and amfAR.

GS: With the 2020 election front and center on everyone's minds, if you are asked to spin at a candidate's fundraiser or, ultimately a

candidate's victory celebration, is that something you would do or do you prefer to stay out of politics?

TY: I don't like to discuss politics, but I did remix the campaign song for Hillary Clinton's run for the Presidency of the United States of America in 2016. The song titled "Stronger Together" features recording artist Jessica Sanchez. I also had the opportunity to play at Hillary's fundraising rallies in Washington, DC.

GS: You are known for being incredibly busy with DJ and remix projects. Are there any on which you are currently working that you are particularly excited about and want to share with the readers?

TY: My focus is always music first, whether it's original productions for my own label Ferosh Records or expanding my discography with fresh remixes for other artists and labels. I am currently in development with a fun new project but will not reveal any details until the time is right.

Getting Nude to Feel RenewedDan Carter Leads the Trend in Naked Yoga

Dan Carter has been teaching naked yoga classes in Washington DC for the past three years. As the founder of Danimal (a combination of Dan and animal - get it?) yoga, he's built the largest and most social nude yoga group in DC, with over 1,000 members!

Now, he's ready to go national. This May, he is inviting guys to join him in Palm Springs for a long weekend of uninhibited camaraderie under the hot desert sun.

His Self Renewal: A Naked Health & Fitness Retreat will take place May 14-18 at Inndulge (601 S Grenfall Rd, Palm Springs, CA), one of the cities' top gay resorts, and will feature Dan leading classes such as "Yoga for Sexual Health" and "Drum Up Your Bum. All sessions will have an emphasis on strengthening, stretching and encouraging men to connect and fall in love with their bodies.

"All classes are non-sexual however intimacy and touch will be important bonding components to the weekend," Dan explains. "A huge part of the experience will be building a real sense of family between the two dozen men in attendance."

Matt Sunderland: We spoke with the naked Yogi to learn more. Let's start with the most important question. How long does it take to be able to do a split?

Daniel Carter: I get asked this all the time! I don't remember a time I wasn't able to do a split but I have many students whose hips are shaped in a way that they'll never do one. I can teach a student to do a split variation that increases hip mobility and provides a cathartic release within five classes. I think that's what really important.

MS: Why should guys consider taking up yoga?

DC: Yoga is a mind-body practice. In addition to toning up muscles,





improving breath and lubricating joints, yoga also hones the nervous system and the bodies response to the world's stressors.

MS: Is there a benefit to doing yoga in the nude?

DC: There are huge benefits! We talk about the experience as an un-shielding. Yoga is a very vulnerable practice with all the precarious shapes we bend into, by removing clothes, our last sheath, we make ourselves even more vulnerable and we grow from it. It also helps me, as the instructor, see your lungs, muscles and joints at work so I can give smarter cues and better hands-on adjusts.

MS: What exactly did you do to achieve that badonkadonk?

DC: I've always had a bit of a butt, but I got it to be bigger through a combination of yoga, pilates and regular squatting. Unfortunately, it has made shopping for jeans more difficult, but I feel much healthier and happier.



MS: Does yoga increase the libido? DC: All fitness, in healthy moderation, contributes to libido. What's really nice about yoga is we not only focus on energizing the body, we focus on relaxation. To have incredible sex, you

need to be able to get into that blissful rest space before things really start to heat up.

MS: What are the biggest misconceptions about yoga?

DC: That it's only for one kind of person. Yoga is for everybody: every shape, color, age... In fact, the word yoga literally translates to "bring together".

MS: What's your advice to someone who is new to yoga? DC: Take a private yoga class with a teacher who instructs beginners. If that's not in your budget, take a beginner class, arrive early, and introduce yourself to the instructor.

MS: What's your advice to guys who may be on the fence about dropping trou with strangers?
DC: The grass is truly

greener on this side of the fence! I have had a shocking amount of guys take a risk on one of my retreats as their first yoga experience and they've never been dissatisfied. If you've got anxiety around social nudity, your yoga practice or anything else, email me through my website and let's talk about it.

MS: Why did you choose to do the retreat in Palm Springs?

DC: Palm Springs is my happy place! There is something so breathtaking about the palms set against the mountain and desert. Then there is the gorgeous mid-century architecture that transports you to Hollywood's golden era. But most importantly, there are the handsome boys, sunning their tan, rippling skin by the crystal blue swimming pools. I chose to do the retreat specifically at the INNdulge resort because it is the perfect encapsulation of all three of those visuals! In addition to being a beautiful space in which to hold a retreat, I am a huge fan of their salt water pool, which is so kind on the skin.

MS: We all head into a vacation with expectations. What can we expect from the Self Renewal: A Naked Health and Fitness Retreat?

DC: This will be an absolutely transformative weekend. Men leave these retreats with a renewed sense of purpose and love of self.

Gay Tropical Bargain - Your PV Vacation

Puerto Vallarta, Mexico is the premiere LGBT resort in North America and winter is a perfect time to visit. It's the dry season and temperatures are in the low to mid-80s every day. Your cost would be half what you would pay for a similar vacation in Florida. It's on the Pacific Ocean on the largest Bay in Mexico and is a steal. The food is excellent with lots of seafood and Mexican dishes. And did I forget to mention that Tequila comes from a small town nearby of the same name?


Nestled in the Zona Romantica (old town) is the LGBTQ district with its many charming hotels, bars, and restaurants which are all steps from each other on cobblestone streets. Don't miss the farmers' market on Saturdays and Art Walk Wednesday nights. The Malecon, a sculpture lined beach walkway leads you to the Playa de los Muertos beach and pier. South of the pier you will find the gay beach.

WHAT TO DO

Sailing on Banderas Bay with Vallarta Adventures is a great way to see wildlife like the whale sharks, sting rays (which the locals call manta rays), pelicans, blue footed booby birds (which dive for fish), and dolphins. Our sailing adventure stopped to paddle board, snorkel, and swim on a great beach on the northern part of Banderas Bay. The trip leaves from the Marina Nuevo Vallarta. Book your adventure at Vallarta-adventures.com.

The Vallarta Botanical Gardens is a 50-minute bus ride down the coast and up into the mountains at 1,500 feet. It is a "dry season tropical forest" with lots of unique plants and trees. They feature tropical plants like the sun burn tree (the Gumbo Limbo) as well as swimming in the bottom of the canyon in the Rio Sendero. Have lunch at the fabulous Rooftop Restaurant featuring local fare. Don't miss the Orchid Conservatory as well as the Vanilla Plantation walks. To get to the gardens, catch the El Tuito bus at Carraza at Aguacate Streets. The fare is around 40 pesos.

There are several beach clubs on the beach catering to the community including the Blue Chairs and the



Green Chairs (Ritmos). It's never a dull moment as peddlers stop by try to sell you souvenirs. You can order lunch under the beach umbrellas as well as drinks. It makes for a great day.

You can work out daily at The Fit Club which features day passes as well as longer term pricing options.

NIĞHTLIFE

I saw the fabulous Kim Kuzma at the Palms Cabaret who did her British Invasion show featuring songs from Annie Lennox, Adele, and British singers and groups. You can see the show Tuesdays and Saturdays at 7: 30 p.m. The cabaret is at 508 Olas Altas, the main street in the Zona Romanica (Old Town). Tickets at

www.thepalmcabaret.com.

Many of the bars are on Lazaro Cardenas Street including Mr. Flamingo

(347 Lazaro Cardenas on Vallarta) and CC Slaughters. The others are down the street in the Zona Olas Altas including the Anonimo, a video bar which has three floors and great views of the street scene. Catch the nightly drink specials including the 50-peso Cosmos on Sunday. Then grab a slushie drink at the nearby Blondies Bar.

Swedes Restaurant and Bar features Cosmos for 40 pesos all night Wednesday and also serves excellent food. Show your Palm Cabaret ticket for 15 percent off.

Up the hill are two rooftop bars located in condos but open to the public which feature great views of the sunset. They are the Pinnacle Rooftop Bar and The Signature Lounge both which feature great happy hours.

Old Town has 32 LGBT bars with something for everyone.

GETTING THERE

I took Southwest Airlines via Houston on the way down and via Denver on the way back. American Airlines and Alaska Airlines also has service to PVR as does United.

From the airport, catch the city bus for just 10 pesos (50 cents US) to town (look for the sign on the window saying Centro or Tunnel). You will find the stop just to the left as you exit the airport.

WHERE TO STAY

I stayed at the Hotel
Mercurio in the heart of Old
Town. The rates are very
reasonable and the rooms
surround the pool which has a
great bar and restaurant.
Sundays is the beer bust (Beer,
Boys, and Burgers) which also
features a drag and a strip
show from 4 p.m. to 7
p.m. Happy Hour starts daily at
3 p.m. Book your room


at *www.hotel-mercurio.com*. They also have a swim suit store. Even if you can't stay there, stop by for a meal or drink or to buy a swim suit. You will find them and Francisco Rodriugez #168.



I have also stayed at the 50 Callejon del Amendro condos (book at **www.pvrpv.com** which also offers other condos such as the V399 where my friends stayed).

Other options include the La Terraza Inn and The Almar Hotel although the latter apparently now has a \$8 resort fee. (I boycott hotels which such surcharges.)





WHERE TO EAT

Daiquiri Dick's has great views of the beach as well as excellent Mexican and American Food.

Barra Light features great salads and fresh carrot juice.

Dee's Coffee near the Pier and Vallarta Coffee Roasters both have excellent coffee drinks.

The Hotel Mercurio has the best breakfast in town. The selection varies daily but is authentic local fare. My

favorite was the beef picadillo, a beef hash with vegetables and lots of spices. Plus, the fresh fruit which included papaya.

TRAVEL TIPS

Puerto Vallarta is a bargain. Food and drinks are about half what you would pay at home and the hotels are much cheaper than other warm weather destinations. There are around 18 Mexican pesos to the dollar. 100 pesos equals around 5 dollars. (Drop the 0 and divide by 2 to go from pesos to dollars). Your ATM card will work in

Your ATM card will work in Mexico. Use it at the banks for the best rates.

Meghan Trainor Is Living Her Best 'Yaaas, B*tch' Life

Pop star on her generous lesbian fans and tipping drag queens with Sam Smith's money

It's not necessarily all about that bass. It's also all about that time Sam Smith – yes, that Sam Smith – slipped Meghan Trainor some singles so she could tip some Meghan Trainor drag queens.

Because even before Trainor captured adoration from the Grammy voting academy, who named her Best New Artist in 2016, the 26-year-old pop star had arguably already won an artist's most valuable asset: the LGBTQ community's enduring affection.

Before dropping her third fulllength, *Treat Myself*, Trainor rang to talk about the LGBTQ community's influence on her new body-positive mentality, lesbians who want to go down on her for a very specific amount of time, and finally being old enough to go to the gay bars that play her songs. In fact, she got so much off her chest during our phone calls that at the end of our second one she raved, "Such great therapy!"


Chris Azzopardi: When were you first aware of your LGBTQ fanbase? Meghan Trainor: Oh, early in the beginning. "Bass" had just come out. (That Pride) Atlanta show (in 2014), I'll never forget it. I had no fans, I was so new, and they made me feel like a superstar. It was, like, 9,000 people on this big lawn and just the coolest thing ever. I did that and a gay club in Florida, I think, in the early, early days and I remember that was the night this father velled out, "You saved my daughter's life," and that has been with me ever since, because that's not something you hear every day. I was so new and so not famous.

CA: Did you have this many queer fans as a kid growing up in Nantucket, Massachusetts? MT: Not really, no. (Laughs.) A lot of people weren't coming out in high school back in Nantucket that I knew of. I knew one friend that came out, but he came out when I moved away, so I never got to celebrate it with him. Now he dresses like a girl sometimes and he's the prettiest woman ever. (The LGBTQ community) wasn't as big as it is in Los Angeles, obviously. I love it though. I love being in a place where it's fully accepted, and I keep saying this in every interview, but my entire team is gay.


CA: How did headlining L.A. Pride last year during the 50th anniversary of Stonewall standout from other Prides you've performed at?

MT: This one was really special on many different levels. It felt like a

many different levels. It felt like a birthday that I'll never forget. It was just so magical because my setlist was one of the best I've ever had: I threw in







"Dancing Queen" by ABBA, and that really got the crowd going, and I performed "Can't Dance" for the first time and did this amazing dance with it (laughs).

And the big reveal was my booty! My butt was out and about, and the only audience I would be comfortable showing off my body and my ass for is my LGBTQ community because they accept and love me for who I am. I've never had more screams! It made me feel so confident, and like a queen. That opened up a whole world of: I'm gonna wear more form-fitting outfits because I do love myself and my body. And I have been. I don't know if you got a chance

to see me on *The Voice* but I'm feelin' my legs, and my butt was out.

CA: But there are times when you're not as confident as your music makes you seem?

MT: I mean, I'm way more confident than I was. This career has actually helped me so much in that way, like feeling beautiful and seeing pictures of myself that I actually like. Being on camera and being on TV, I'm like, "Wow, guys, I'm pretty!" I say that way more. Everyone I think just works on it every day. But I definitely have learned a lot of lessons with this career; some good ones, like saying out loud how beautiful you are and saying you're going to really believe it. If you just

talk negative about yourself, that's what your brain's hearing and that's what it'll learn. So I try to stay positive.

CA: Did you ever struggle with seeing yourself on TV?

MT: I was worried with (hosting reality-TV music competition) The Four because I had never done a TV show before. But I can't stop watching that show, man! (Laughs.) I watched it and everything that I did – I was a fan of myself watching myself. I'm so lame! I was just like, "Yaaas, bitch. Say what you feel." And I was like, "Look how

cute she is." Just talkin' as if I were a different person.

CA: I hope everybody can someday feel as confident as you do.

MT: I never thought I'd be there, so it's great.

CA: How much has the LGBTQ community influenced the empowerment sensibility in your music?

MT: So much. I remember I had a show in Atlanta, a gay Pride event, in my early career and I never had so many screams before. I've never had so many people just wanting to make love to me.

MT: I think I was just like so in love. I mean, obviously: I was getting married. I'm still so in love. But I was just so live, breathe, sleep just Daryl (Sabara, Trainor's husband). Like, this is my world. So when I was doing the songwriting I was like, "Guys, I'm really boring. I'm just madly in love and everything's so great for me and I don't have anything fun to write about (laughs)."

Then I started writing songs with my older brother because he would just

Then I started writing songs with my older brother because he would just videotape every session, and from that he learned, "Oh, I could be a songwriter." He actually wrote on every single song pretty much, and his love

life is way more interesting than mine, so I started asking him about his life (laughs) and we've been writing amazing songs together. I was like, "This is fun and relatable and not everyone is madly in love." I gotta write for my sweet single souls out there!




CA: Were you happy with the first recording of 'Treat Myself'?

MT: Yeah, I love all my songs. It just feels I'm writing too much about one topic, and then pop music was drowning. It was fading away; it's because hip-hop and urban was having and is still having a moment, and I love that because I'm a fan and it's magical and so cool to watch. But it's like, where's pop? Where'd pop go?

We sent "Waves" to radio because I was like, "I'm putting my foot down; this is my favorite song I've ever written, and I think the production is powerful." It was my favorite music video I've ever done. This one I had no complaints about. And we heard, I guess, from radio, and they're like, "It's just so different; we're trying to wrap our heads around it." Like, what?

CA: Growing up, who were the artists who instilled confidence in you?

MT: Christina Aguilera, Britney Spears, Pussycat Dolls and Rihanna. I love Pussycat Dolls!

CA: 'Treat Myself' was originally supposed to be released in 2018, but then got shelved because you went back into the studio and basically gutted the album and restarted. Where was your headspace when you originally recorded the album versus when you re-recorded it?





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CA: Why the Pussycat Dolls?

MT: Their lyrics – which is funny, 'cause they're like the best dancers ever. But their lyrics, "Don't cha wish your girlfriend was hot like me," like man, I used to roll around in middle school with that and high school and just be like, "This is my song!"

CA: Which song on 'Treat Myself' are you most looking forward to your LGBTQ fans hearing?

MT: "Genetics." It was the first song I wrote with Mike Sabath and Justin Tranter, who are like gods at writing pop music. I went in, actually, with this chorus and I was like, "Everyone keeps wanting me to write another 'All About That Bass' and I wanna just flip 'em off (laughs)." So I found another way of saying I love myself and what I got is: My genetics are pretty dope, and I do have great genetics from my parents. Their skin and their body shapes are just spot on. Like, I was blessed with an hourglass body, which doesn't happen all the time, you know. So I was like, "Fine. Let's give them a genetics song."

So I thought it was sassy and sexy and fun, and something everyone could sing. I wanted grandparents to hear this and be like, "You're welcome, kids." And then when I heard it I was like. "This is so Pussycat Dolls," so then I called Nicole (Scherzinger). She was like, "We should have a singoff." And I was like, "Excuuse me?!" She was like, "We should

have a battle moment where we both sing our hearts out." And I was like, "Da fuck - OK!" At the end, before the last chorus, you'll hear two vocalists just ripping, and it's me and her back and forth. And she wins.

CA: What was it like to have your manager, Tommy Bruce, who's gay, officiate your wedding?

MT: It was everything because he knows me better than anyone. He delivered the opening words, and I always joke that I want them to let me have my Britney Spears microphone, like attached to my ear, and my team is like, "No, they're gonna hear how winded you get sometimes." And I understand that. But he showed up to my wedding with one of those, and he

also knows how much I love T-Pain



music, so he had it on full Auto-Tune and was like, "We're all gathered here todaaaa-yyy-yyy." It was so everything. It was the best.

CA: What is the most impressive drag performance you've seen of a Meghan Trainor song?

MT: Oh, man, I went to The Abbey in L.A. and I was there with Sam Smith and it was one of the cool points in my life. (Sam) gave me dollar bills because it was my second drag show ever and I was like, "I don't have the dollar bills! I didn't bring 'em!" And (Sam) handed me a stack. They did a few of my songs and it was just the best time of my life being like, "Sam, that's my song!" and throwing all the money on them!

CA: What's the story behind you wearing a unicorn onesie when you

guest judged 'RuPaul's Drag Race' in 2017? MT: (Laughs.) Well, I was in the middle of a tour and had that onesie because I was wearing onesies for our meetand-greets. Instead of doing what everyone does when they dress up fully and do the glam, I was like, "Let me show my unicorn pride, let me show what I bring around my tour." I thought it'd be cute. Now when I watch it I'm like, "Oh, why didn't you dress up?"

CA: What was your first time at a gay club like? MT: Well, I remember the gay club called Play (in Nashville) was playing "All About That Bass" and I was 19 or 20. I was like, "Let me in, you're playin' my song!" And they denied me. I was like. "Man!" I couldn't show proof. It was just released and I was like, "You (put) my song on but you don't know my face." Later, I went back and I was like, "Now I'm back and in the VIP."


CA: And surely you've sung that song at Play by now.

MT: No! But I did dance to "Lips Are Movin" with a drag queen! And I remember they had a razor and they made me

shave this guy's hair off. Do you remember that, mom? That was the craziest time in my life. I was like, "Um, are you sure?"

CA: Hi mom! MT: She says hi!



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

I grew up constantly teased for the way I looked. I was extremely underweight compared to most boys. A family member once told me that I "could be a poster child for Ethiopians" (shout out and much love to all the Ethiopians in the world). My self-confidence was terrible growing up, and my environment played a part in my health, however it's helped me understand the psyche of people struggling. It's easy to just give up and say, "This is me and I love myself," however, is it truly you? Do you really love yourself this way? There are three categories I tackle with myself, clients and friends

when dealing with becoming a truly body positive person. These three categories work with each other to help you become a fully rounded healthy homosapien. Category one:

Nutrition. Basic knowledge of nutrition is lacking in today's society. Readily available meals via fast food chains, pre packaged chemically preserved dinners and sugary food items, help lend to the health problems society has including obesity. Human cattle are constantly told they're too busy to cook at home and they should stock on up on certain brands of food for quick easy meals and snacks. 
positive.

The people you hang with, the TV you watch, the music vou listen to, the food you eat and the alcohol you drink all play key factors in mental health. It's important to recognize how you're feeling and how to make changes to help make yourself mentally strong enough to handle everything. Take time to read more instead of watching TV. Take time to meditate/ pray instead of having mainstream news/music constantly blasting in your ear. I like to take time to walk the lake and just clear my head with nature. Mental health in conjunction with nutrition and physical fitness is truly body positive.

There's so much more I can say, but I feel I've given you a great blueprint for understanding what body positivity truly is, what it's not and how to incorporate behaviors into your daily life. Tune out of mainstream ideas of body positivity and tune into reality. Healthy Self: Heal thy Self.

"So anything I tell you, you have to keep it secret?" "Yes," I agreed, "if you seek me out for my advice as a lawyer, I will keep your secrets. "Okay," he responded, "can we go somewhere and talk in private?"

We walked out in back, and Josh began. "You've got to keep this secret. If it gets out, I'm dead." He paused a long time, gathering his strength to go on. "So the fact is... I'm gay. But no one knows, and if this gets out, my



parents will disown me, I will lose my place on the team, and I'll probably get beat up. I should be out there already, with the LGBT students, but I'm too afraid to come out at this point in my life. I will do it after I get to college, but right now, I have too much to lose."

He came to what he wanted to ask. "There's only one person in the school who knows my secret: The shop teacher – Dave. He knows, and he's keeping my secret. So want I wanted to ask is... is there any way I could join the other LGBT students in their camp? I was thinking I would ask some of my friends on the team to camp out with me. It would be a good way for all of us to get to know the gay guys in the camp, and I would make sure everybody is respectful. So that's what I was hoping."

Following this "attorney/client consultation," I discussed the matter with Dave (who confirmed he already knew Josh's secret), and following further discussion with Larry, the vice principal (who only needed to know that the school's star quarterback really, really wanted to camp out), a solution was found.

Later that same day, Larry happened to check on the contents of Josh's student locker, and finding therein a football which had taped to its side a slip of paper on which was written the word GUN, the Judgment of Athena was soon extended to Josh and six of his teammates, each of whom confessed that he, too, had helped Josh overstep the bounds of "Zero Tolerance."






JN: Are you coming to Chicago for the annual Grabby Awards show? JM: Yeah, sure!

Missouri Lawmakers File 15th Anti-LGBTQ Bill



Last week Missouri lawmakers filed their fifteenth bill targeting LGBTQ Missourians, and specifically rearing an aggressive agenda to restrict the rights and dignity of transgender youth. From banning lifesaving medical care, the fair chance to be part of a team, creating defining parameters for gender, and suggesting state funding should be used to discriminate, the Missouri legislature is sending a clear message that they believe transgender youth do not belong.

Transgender youth are some of the most at risk in our community. The 2016 Williams Institute Report estimates that there are 150,000 transgender American youth (ages 13-17), and roughly 25,000 transgender Missourians. Five bills ((HB 1721 (Schnelting), HB 2051 (Pollock), HB 2210 (Moon), SB 842 (Emery), SB 848 (Eigel)) look at criminalizing life-saving medical care for transgender youth by combining preferoignal papalities for medical professional penalties for medical care providers with penalties for parents or guardians, including a requirement that they should be reported to Child Services. These bills overlook best practices backed by the American Academy of Pediatrics, and other mainstream medical associations, and penalizes healthcare professionals and parents for providing affirming, life-saving care to some of our most vulnerable young people.

Denying best-practice medical care and support to transgender youth can be life-threatening. Research shows that transgender youth whose families support their gender identity have a 52% decrease in suicidal thoughts, a 48% decrease in suicide attempts, and significant increases in self-esteem and general

Shira Berkowitz, PROMO's Communications Manager, says, "Medical professionals, not politicians, should decide what medical care is in the best interest of a patient. Our leadership should be creating opportunities for Missouri children to succeed, not threatening their health and safety. So we must remember what this is really about: whether LGBTQ people should be treated fairly across all areas of life—or whether they can be unfairly fired, kicked out of a restaurant, denied an apartment, or denied the health care

they need, just because of who they are."

Additionally, two joint resolutions, SJR50 (O'Laughlin R-18) and HJR 82 (Ross R-142) call for the placement of a ballot measure at the November 2020 election to amend the state constitution to require student athletes to participate in sports according to their sex assigned at birth. Playing sports provides student athletes with important lessons about leadership, self-discipline, teamwork, success, and failure—as well as the joy and shared excitement of being part of a team. Denying transgender students the opportunity to participate in sports denies them invaluable physical, social, and emotional well-being.

This year, PROMO urges lawmakers to pass MONA, a state law that would add sexual orientation and gender identity to Missouri's Human Rights Statute, which currently prohibits discrimination in employment, housing, and public accommodations for other protected categories, including race, sex, and national origin. According to the Williams Institute, more than 160,000 LGBTQ adults in Missouri would benefit from an expanded state nondiscrimination law that includes sexual orientation and gender identity.

District Court Holds Public University Professor Does Not Have a Constitutional Right to Discriminate Against Transgender Students

U.S. District Judge **Susan J. Dlott** dismissed a federal lawsuit filed by Professor **Nicholas Meriwether** against Shawnee State University. Meriwether claimed that Shawnee State violated his alleged First Amendment rights by enforcing a policy requiring equal treatment of transgender students after the university disciplined him for repeatedly referring to Jane Doe, a transgender female student, by a male honorific and pronouns, despite using the correct gendered honorifics and pronouns for all other students in the class.

The National Center for Lesbian Rights (NCLR), along with *Adam Unikowsky* of Jenner & Block LLP

and Jennifer Branch of Gerhardstein & Branch Co., LPA, intervened in the lawsuit on behalf of Jane Doe and Sexuality and Gender Acceptance (SAGA), Shawnee State's LGBTQ student group. After being granted permission to intervene, Doe and SAGA moved to dismiss the complaint.

Adopting the recommendation of Magistrate Judge *Karen Litkovitz*, Judge Dlott found that "[Meriwether's] speech – the manner by which he addressed a transgender student – was not protected under the First Amendment." Judge Dlott also found no evidence that Shawnee State discriminated against Meriwether based on his religious beliefs or because of religious animus.

"We are pleased the Court affirmed that schools can ensure that all students are able to learn and the access educational opportunities available to all students without fear of discrimination," said *Asaf Orr*, Senior Staff Attorney and Director of the Transgender Youth Project at the National Center for Lesbian Rights.

"Since this lawsuit began, transgender students have been worried that they would have to start skipping classes or avoid particular professors because Shawnee State would no longer be able to effectively address bullying, harassment, and mistreatment of transgender students. SAGA and its members are relieved that the Court recognized the importance of Shawnee State's antidiscrimination and antiharassment policies to transgender people on campus. This is a big step towards progress for all transgender people on Shawnee State's campus," said *Jae Keniston*, President of SAGA.





Combining punk, hardcore, and post-hardcore with emotional lyrics and melody is nothing new for the band that epitomizes heartfelt optimism with DIY work-ethic and spirit. But never has this been more evident than this 15-song barn burner of a record. Set at a blistering pace, songs like "Shook By Your Shaved Head" and "Nothing To Say" rip the listener out of their

monotonous day-to-day and drain away all the pressure and self-doubt that manifests inside. When singer, Jordan Pundik, sings, "You've gotta take your life back. You've got so much more to give. That's what I say to myself when I feel like giving into the shame I feel. Won't let it keep me standing still," you can't help jumping up, throwing a fist in the air, and singing the words out at the top of your lungs. This is what New Found Glory has always been about - inspiring people to not be afraid of the odds, to lift each other up, and get up again.

drop on Friday, February 21st via UNFD.


Capturing the rollercoaster of emotions that comes with trying to deal with your demons, Mending Breaking spans six tracks of alt-rock, punk and heavy. Introvert vocalist *Audie Franks* explains that the release hones in on the idea of self-loathing, and the feeling of knowing you're in a rut and need to get out

"Sometimes you get in those spaces and you want others to help you, but you also want to be able to do it yourself," he says. "The title came about because of the idea of someone trying to fix themselves and going through cycles of mending and then breaking again. If you listen to the EP from start to finish it actually goes around in that circle of mending and breaking."

Arguably capturing the idea of this roller coaster in full is the EP's title track "Mending Breaking." Franks explains that it stands on the heavier side of all their work, and that searing heaviness seizes the aggravation of trying over and over to piece yourself together (hear the line: "I'm struggling with everything, I always let myself down with this self-doubt, I have to pull myself out of this self doubt").

The EP was recorded close to home at Newcastle's Tommirock Studios, with the band's close friend and collaborator *Mitta Norath* (Endless Heights, Eat Your Heart Out) at the helm of engineering duties. A diverse yet seamless set of songs, Introvert seize an anthemic and heartfelt brand of rock on this release.
