

Boze knows: An interview with gay writer Boze

Hadleigh

To say that gay author Boze Hadleigh is prolific is an understatement. The author of nearly 30 books (including those forthcoming), Hadleigh has made a name for himself by going where few others dare: the dark underbelly of Hollywood. In his latest book, "Game Show Confidential: The Story of An American Obsession" (Lyons Press, 2023), Hadleigh doesn't play around, pulling back the sparkly curtain to dare to reveal truths some would never consider. Hadleigh recently took time out of his busy writing schedule to answer a few questions about "Game Show Confidential."

Gregg Shapiro: I know that some authors consider books they've written to be like their offspring, and don't like to play favorites, but with 29 books to your credit, is there one for which you feel a particular affinity?

Boze Hadleigh: I think my seven books that focus on the LGBT-etc. presence in and contributions to the entertainment world, though "juicy" and entertaining, are quite educational, both for gay readers and especially for heterosexuals who have no idea how big and excellent the "gay world" is. In particular I'd say my 2020 book "Inside the Hollywood Closet," because in quotes directly from the horses' mouths we get what being LGBTetc. and working and living in "showbiz" is like - most gay stars have to "act" whenever they leave their house - and "IHC" shows how much has improved over the years for gay people but also how much has not improved and how some things are worse.

GS: What's involved in deciding on the topics for your books? BH: Usually, it's what interests me. "Game Show Confidential" evolved

from my being asked to write a biography of "Jeopardy!" host Alex Trebek (partly because I was on the show and won). But that didn't interest me - frankly, dull, plus before I was on the show I'd seen him make three separate anti-gay comments, which as I say in the book is three too many. A few times I've done a book because the topic interested me but there was no book. So, I did "Celebrity Feuds!" because at the library I only found two feud-related books. One on the Hatfields and McCoys (thrilling, right?) and one on "the writers' wars, meaning the fight to establish a writers' union in Hollywood. My book includes Laverne vs. Shirley, Diana Ross leaving the Supremes, Abbott vs. Costello, also family feuds like Julia and Eric Roberts, the Jacksons, and the gay feuds between Truman Capote and Gore Vidal.

GS: Hollywood is a prominent subject in your books with at least half of them being about movies, actors, and actresses. Would it be fair to say that your fascination with Hollywood is equaled by that of the public's obsession? BH: Overall, I'd say we live in a media culture and celebrity journalism has become too prevalent. A lot about Hollywood, including reality shows and many current sitcoms plus many game shows past and present, doesn't interest me. Also, my interest, and my books reflect it, is in the reality behind the show of show business. Say, you see a magazine or tabloid photo of a male movie star and his wife and perhaps it includes his manager or personal trainer. The caption only mentions hubby-andwife, not the fact that the other guy is hubby's lover. There is so much deception in showbiz, which is America's basic culture, and I like to show the truth behind it. It usually boils down to catering to the average, often bigoted public so that companies (studios, networks,



newspapers, etc.) can make maximum profits. In other words, the business end determines what is shown.

GS: Your new book, "Game Show Confidential," is being released around the same time that ABC's "The Game Show Show," which features queer voices such as Margaret Cho, Patrick Gomez, and Guy Branum, is airing. Is it a coincidence that a book and TV program about game shows are arriving concurrently or is something else at work? **BH:** No, just serendipity. ABC heard about my then-upcoming book and asked me to fly to L.A. for an oncamera interview, but I was out of the country. Would have been a great tie-in. The fact is that during COVID game shows have become much more popular, including new

GS: In "Game Show Confidential," you mention game shows that originated in Britain and then became popular in the US. Were there many that started in the US that went on to success in other countries?

and Buzzr, and shows about game

shows. Betty White called game

shows "TV's feel-good genre."

BH: Yes, many US game shows have had foreign editions. Usually, the most popular are in Britain and Australia. Foreign-language versions are popular, too, from South America

to francophone Canada to Southeast Asia. In Indonesia their version of "Tic Tac Dough" was titled "Tak Tik BOOM," spelled that way!

GS: In the book, you spill a lot of tea, including revealing things about Bob Barker, such as his sexism and racism, as well as Pat Sajak being sexist, racist, and homophobic. Were there people you weren't able to mention for various reasons?

BH: Besides Sajak, the sidebar most of the chapters have sidebars titled "File Under Bigotry" includes Chuck Woolery, Bob Eubanks and Steve Harvey. I also more or less answer the pertinent question, "Is Drew Carey gay?" He's the one who kept bringing it up. As for still-taboo subjects, I didn't include the longstanding rumors that perhaps "Password" host Allen Ludden (whose father died in 1919 at 26 from the global virus pandemic that's still mislabeled "the Spanish flu") and wife Betty White were basically very good friends.

GS: Why do you think so many game show hosts, including Chuck Woolery, are right wingers?

BH: That is, so many of the older male hosts. One journalist quoted in "GSC" says much of that derived from a time when white male hosts held a monopoly – no women, no people of color. However, Steve Harvey is also bigoted, and I mention that fellow African American Kevin Hart lost the coveted Oscarhost gig due to his recurrent homophobia. Alas, bigotry is not limited to any one group.

GS: Nevertheless, Merv Griffin, whose homosexuality was an open secret, created an unparalleled game show empire. Do you think his remaining closeted was the reason or was there something else?

BH: Merv's two big hits were "Jeopardy!" and "Wheel of Fortune." The game show giants were the ruthless Goodson-Todman empire –


there's a chapter on them [laughs]! Griffin did not need to hide behind Eva Gabor. but one reason for that was rival real estate tycoon Donald Trump making homophobic comments about him, including the nickname "Mery the Pery." Griffin was his own boss, he wasn't an actor, he was no sex symbol. I think his closetedness was due to his generation, where everything about being gay was demonized. He remained ashamed of being gay, despite the progress being affected mostly by younger generations.

GS: Meanwhile, Jane Lynch, who is an out lesbian, currently hosts the primetime revival of "The Weakest Link," and before that hosted "Hollywood Game Night," co-created by Sean Hayes, for several years. What do you think, if anything, has changed?

BH: There's now a diversity of game show hosts, including to some extent lesbian and gay ones – in that order, because general audiences are more comfortable with a Jane or Ellen than with most openly gay males. Ironically, Charles Nelson Reilly once hosted a game show about hetero romance, and for two whole years Rip Taylor hosted "The \$1.98 Beauty Show."

GS: Speaking of stars competing on game shows, what do you think about "Celebrity Jeopardy" and "Celebrity Wheel of Fortune"?

BH: What makes them interesting is seeing – at least on "Celebrity Jeopardy!" – how smart certain celebs are. As Nelson Reilly said, and is quoted in "GSC," lots of celebs and most sports figures avoided shows like "Jeopardy!" and "Password" but were glad to come on "The Match Game" (where




Charles was a longtime panelist), because that show had no wrong answers.

GS: Have you started working on or thinking about your next book project?

BH: Due in spring 2024 is an outrageous quotes collection currently titled "I Can't Believe They Said That!!" Yes, two exclamation marks! Like all my books, including the two animal-themed ones – Betty White gave a lovely blurb for "Life's a Pooch" in 2017 - (it's) very gayinclusive. That book is complete. I'm working on one about celebs and suicide – not just showbiz, though mostly – which includes a chapter on gay suicides. As Bea Arthur pointed out, 30 percent of teen suicides are due to homophobia. And today, with the Trump-inspired backlash against gays, lesbians, drag queens, and trans people, it's up to all of us to actively oppose this pro-fascist bigotry and attempts to turn back the clock to a sexual Dark Ages.

DJ Tom Stephan in the flesh at Furball

What is it about a DJ that allows them to have a lengthy and successful career? Aside from being a turntable master, knowing how to read and work a room and keep people dancing from sunset to sunrise, or being a top-notch remixer. It helps if they're as friendly and warm as Tom Stephan. Having a sense of humor, which Stephan has in abundance, also goes a long way. Also known as Superchumbo, Stephan has DJed countless clubs, festivals, and parties, and includes to be one of the hardest-working DJs behind the decks. Tom was kind enough to make time for an interview during one of his rare weekends off from DJing in advance of his August 11 date at Furball during Market Days in Chicago.

Gregg Shapiro: For those not in the know, how did you come up with your DJ name Superchumbo?

Tom Stephan: The name Superchumbo came from the midto-late '90s. I was at a rave outside of Lisbon, Portugal where Danny Tenaglia was playing. I was there with Rob Di Stefano from Twisted (Records). We were there, dancing all night and enjoying ourselves, let's say. On our way back, driving back to Lisbon, we stopped at a gas station. I got out (to fill the tank), and I look at the pumps and they say "Chumbo" and "Super" or "S/ Chumbo," something like that. I said, "Do you want Chumbo or Super Chumbo." For the rest of the day, I was known as Superchumbo. That's where the name came from. Then I found out later Schumbo, which is actually pronounced "shoombo" in Portuguese, doesn't mean "super," but "without." As in without lead (chumbo is a metal).

GS: You will be spinning at Furball in Chicago on August 11. What are you most looking forward to about that event?

TS: This is my first time spinning at Furball, but not my first time spinning Chicago or at Market Days. Market Days is always amazing weekend Chicago. I'm looking forward plavina Furball because

it's the kind of party that I like to play, which is a sweaty, sexy, raunchy kind of thing.


GS: How often do you get to Chicago?

TS: Probably three or four times a year.

GS: As a progressive house DJ, what does it mean to you when you get to spin in Chicago, the birthplace of house music?

TS: It's amazing! And so many people from the UK (where Stephan is based) are so jealous. I think I often play something that I feel like is a Chicago thing. Cajmere, or something. In the same way that when I play in New York I always play something that's very New York to me. I'm always aware of being

there and what that means, I guess.



TS: No. I can't say that we even ever met, although I saw him DJ many times, and the last time was possibly one of the last DJ sets that he played in London. I believe it was just a few months before he passed. But I do work regularly with someone that I consider to be a Chicago legend, and that's Celeda. In fact, I'm working on something new with her right now.

GS: Fantastic! Your Furball set in Chicago is taking place at Metro. Were you aware that in the



late 1970s, long before Metro became a renowned live music venue, that it was home to a gay disco called Center Stage where Grace Jones and Sylvester were among the acts to perform there?

TS: You're kidding me!

GS: I'm not kidding you. TS: I had no idea. That's amazing!

GS: It was quite a place.
People danced on the main floor, as well as on the stage where there was a kind of early laser light show on a backdrop. And the balconies were used for what balconies were used for in the late '70s

TS: [Laughs] That's really amazing. Now I'm super excited.

GS: I had the pleasure of interviewing Yoko Ono in 2007 before she performed at the Pitchfork Music Festival, in support of the "Open Your Box" album on which the Superchumbo remix of "Kiss Kiss Kiss" appears. What did having the chance to remix Yoko mean to you?

TS: This is really funny because I'm also speaking to someone today who's writing a book about Yoko. He just reached out to me yesterday. It's David Sheff, the guy that wrote "Beautiful Boy," the book about his son's drug addiction. I was completely blown away when he contacted me. I've been emailing back and forth with him with my Yoko stories. It was amazing because when I was a kid, my dad and my uncle had a music store and I used to work there on the weekends. Well, work, I was like 10 years old, I was just allowed to hang out there, basically, I used to dust, or something. I would hang out there on Saturday afternoon, and then I would get maybe paid five bucks or else I could like take home a seveninch single. I took home "(Just Like) Starting Over" by John Lennon, which just came out, and the B-side was "Kiss Kiss Kiss." I discovered it on there. That, at the time when I was 10 years old, was the craziest song I'd ever heard. We had a show and tell thing at school and I brought it in to play it. [Laughs] the teacher was not happy about it at all. She took it off and wouldn't let me finish playing it, which made me love it even more. That was a really

important thing for me. After Orange Factory did (the remix of) "Open Your Box, they decided to go through Yoko's back catalog and do some remixes. I was approached and they asked. "What would vou like to remix?" I didn't even have to think about it: "Kiss Kiss Kiss." The song has been with me since I was a kid. The crazy thing about that story for me is I've

been DJing in Tokyo for about 20 years now. The promoter that brought me over there most times, Mr. Yoshida, who's done loads for the gay scene in Tokyo, brought me there for maybe the tenth time, and we were celebrating because of that. He asked me, "Do you know why I first brought you here?" I said, "No." He said it was because he loved the remix I did of Yoko Ono's "Kiss Kiss Kiss." It's so bizarre. This record has made its way through my life.

GS: In addition to Yoko, you have worked with some of music's most legendary divas including Beyoncé, Kylie Minogue, Shakira, Missy Elliott, and the late Tina Turner. Are there a few others with whom you haven't yet worked that you would love to work with in the near future?

TS: Madonna. [Laughs] I was asked to do a remix of "Medellín," which I can't say was one of my favorite songs, but I wasn't going to turn down the opportunity anyway. But she rejected it. Madonna doesn't like me, I guess. But that's okay. I never get to anybody that I remix, or verv rarely. Except for Kylie Minogue.



I did with I remixed "Can't Get You Out of My Head." We did a photoshoot together. It was funny because [laughs]...she's a pro and she's giving looks and I'm kind of standing there just basically nervous because I've got my hands on Kylie Minogue. She said, "Oh, come on Tom! I know you're gay, but just grab me!" That's my memory of that photo shoot, and the picture is just awful.

GS: Do you have any dream collaborations?

TS: Somebody that I feel like I would like to do...I'm just a huge fan of Depeche Mode. I even had a chance to remix Nitzer Ebb, probably one of my favorite bands ever. So, Depeche Mode comes up as something I would love to do because I love them so much. This new album, I think, is one of their strongest in a long time. I think it's really great.

GS: I'm glad you mentioned Nitzer Ebb and Depeche Mode because I was wondering if there's a genre of music that you listen to for personal enjoyment that might surprise your legion of fans?

TS: I listen to a lot of rock, actually. I don't even know where it came from, but I suddenly realized that I was obsessed with Queens of the Stone Age. I listen to them a lot when I go to the gym. I've also been listening to Arctic Monkeys. That's what I listen to a lot. My nephew's got a band called Blankstate, and I listen to them a lot. When I'm not working or working on music, I don't tend to listen to the music I DJ, unless I'm checking something. I just posted a recording of my set from Alegria, and I wanted to listen to it to make sure I was happy with everything before I stuck it up online. Then, on a Sunday, coming back from DJing or whatever, some of the new Arctic Monkeys is pretty mellow and I love listening to that or Steely Dan or something like that.

GS: I live in Fort Lauderdale, and while this interview is taking place, you are visiting Florida. Do you have any thoughts you'd like to share about Florida's homophobic governor, Ron DeSantis?

TS: [Sighs and laughs] I mean, I think he's an asshole. I think it's just a cheap way of trying to polarize people and win votes. I don't know, maybe he is as homophobic as he acts. I think it's just a manipulative thing. It's a shame because my mother lives here, near Saint Petersburg. I go to Miami often to DJ. I like coming to Florida. I think it's really sad, what he's doing. It's really upsetting. Just recently, hearing about the Supreme Court thing the other day, it really bothered me. I feel hurt about this. I like to think I'm OK with who I am, and I'm not affected by this kind of thing. But it occurred to me that I am affected by it. What's wrong with people? It seems totally bizarre to me that it's being done under the excuse of Christianity, which means that I don't understand anything about Christianity. I thought you weren't supposed to go around judging everyone else.



The LGBTQ+ friendly cities of Saugatuck and Douglas in Southwest Michigan cannot be beat for a summer weekend or vacation. The numerous sandy beaches along Lake Michigan are stunning. Two nearby state parks are great for hiking and swimming. Ride your bike on the Kal Haven Trail in South Haven. Kayak on the Kalamazoo River. Take a sunset cruise out of Saugatuck. Explore the art galleries of Douglas and Saugatuck. Have a drink by the pool with the hotties (and a DJ) at the Dunes. Or just relax. Don't forget to enjoy the local blueberries, red haven peaches, and apples. It's a fruit basket.

GETTING THERE

Saugatuck Douglas Fennville is a 2 hour drive from Chicago and just 3 hours from both Detroit and Indianapolis. Gerald R. Ford Airport in Grand Rapids is an option as is

Amtrak (the Pere Marquette goes to Holland). Once there, the community transit on demand bus service (aka the Inter Urban) can be used to get around.

WHERE TO STAY

You are not in Ptown much less Rehoboth. But for the Midwest, it's a lot of fun. There are two great LGBTQ+ resorts.

The Dunes is one of the largest in the country and features rooms, cabins, or a "downstairs" value option. You can walk to Douglas. They have events every night at the bar and the Sunday T Dance (with BBQ) is not to be missed. Nor are the Perfect 10 dancers. You can dance the night away on their incredible outdoor bar area. Book your stay

at dunesresort.com 269/857-1401. Upcoming events include:

July 21-23 Christmas in July. Don't miss Molly and Alex in the Cabaret while DJ Keller Shaw spins the tunes.

August 4-6 Mardi Gras Weekend which includes Elton John tunes in the cabaret.



It profiles 17 women from the community's history. There is other exhibit, A Century of Progress: 100 Years of LGBTQ History in Saugatuck-Douglas is necessary. You will find them at 130 Center Street in Douglas.

WHERE TO EAT

Uncommon Coffee Roasters in Saugatuck has the best coffee in the area. Try a slice of the homemade pizza or a hot sub at Lakeshore Convenience Store in Douglas 155 Blue Star Highway).

Treat yourself to lunch at the Farmhouse Deli in Douglas. Local ingredients and fresh juices available.

The Coral Gables in Saugatuck is extremely popular. Sit outside and watch the boats go by.

The new Chicken Scratch Farm Bakery and Café has great cookies and hot dishes to go.

The What Not in Fennville has great food and a live band on the weekends. Try the perch basket. It is 2405 68th Street in Fennville.








Condominiums Association Turnovers

Q: Last year I bought a new condominium in Andersonville. We are having problems with the developer in turning over the condominium association to the homeowners. What are the developer's responsibilities?

A: I get this question all the time. When the real estate market was hot and condominiums selling like hotcakes, developers were making sales, turning over the building to the homeowners and moving on to their next construction project. When the market turned, sales stopped, leaving developers with more units on their hands. As time passes the homeowners who bought want to know what their rights are from their developer.

Most developer turnovers are without incident and routine. The Illinois Condominium Property Act provides that a "detailed accounting" is to be provided by developer within 60 days after election of the first unit owner board of managers; which is required to be within 60 days after 75 percent of

the units are sold or three years after recording the declaration.


In many situations, the biggest issue becomes whether the developer has properly paid assessments on units during the development period. The Act requires that the developer pay assessments on unsold units beginning with the first conveyance and to collect assessments from owners of sold units during the period from the first sale until turnover to the unit-owner controlled board.

In a recent case, Metropolitan Condominium Association v. Crescent Heights the unit-owner board filed a three-count complaint against the developer and its property manager for declaratory judgment and a "detailed accounting" pursuant to Section 18.2(d)(2) of the Act. The developer contended that it had complied with the Act's requirement of a detailed accounting due to the fact that it had employed a management agent during development, and the unitowner board continued on with the agent as its manager following turnover; therefore having access through the management agent of all records and accounting on unit

assessments.

The unit owners argued that the information provided by the management agent was insufficient and that the Act's requirement for a "detailed accounting" mandated "a breakdown of which units were sold, when they were sold, what assessments were paid for each unit, when the assessments were paid, and whether the developer properly paid assessments for all units during the period prior to the initial sale.

The Appellate Court ruled that a "detailed accounting" under the act must include the sale dates of individual units, the assessments paid on each unit following the sale of the first unit, and the dates on which assessments were paid. The court found the agency




relationship with both the developer and the unit owner board did not preclude the necessity for the detailed accounting by the developer. The purpose of permitting the unit owners to verify that the developer has complied with its duty to pay assessments on unsold units would otherwise be thwarted.

To answer the question: first check how long it has been since the condominium declaration was recorded for your building. If it is over three years, you can compel the developer to turn over the association to the homeowners; same if it is more than 60 days after 75 percent of the units have been sold. Then review all the records and make sure that the developer has been making payment on the unsold units it owned. You may recoup a great deal of cash for your association.

Also be aware that when you buy into an older condo building, you are bound to pay the assessments. And if you don't, they will put a lien on your property or evict you. That's why it's important to be diligent before buying a condo unit, looking into the financials of the governing group before closing on a deal. Before buying, find out if special assessments are anticipated, get a statement of the reserves and find out how they compare to the most recent reserve study.

Burning UpHottie John Duff Fans the Flames in New Track, "House on Fire"

John Duff grew up in a suburb outside of Baltimore. After graduating college, he made his way to the bright lights of New York City, where he worked as an actor and partied for six years. He then moved west to Hollywood to pursue his artistic dreams. He has been in Los Angeles for six years and has released an EP, Homo•Sapien, and several hit tracks including the gay classics "Girly" – who can forget that hilarious video where he battled Bianco Del Rio? - and "High Heels."

His latest single, "House on Fire," is a breezy throwback track that seems to signify that romance is alive, however, in true John Duff fashion, there is a deeper message of concealed infatuation within. The singer dives into the song's creepy subject matter in its chilling music video.

We spoke with John Duff from his home in Los Angeles.

Larry Olsen: You wrote "House on Fire" about a man you went on a date with once that you fantasized was "the one". What was it about him that intrigued you so much?

JD: You know, the whole thing felt like some sort of kismet. I was at a friend's wedding in Tennessee. I left early and while walking back to my hotel. I stopped in at a club I had heard of. Upon entering, I was immediately drawn to this person. He seemed familiar, but was no one I knew. We acknowledged each other with glances and stares, as homosexuals do. I was by myself, and he was with a group. Unsure if any of those people were with him, I did a lap. We made eyes again, but no contact. So, I went home. I may have looked at some apps to see if he would magically appear on a grid, but he didn't. I woke up to a DM

from him the day after. He had recognized me, but was too shy to approach me. We arranged to meet for dinner. I think when you meet someone on vacation. your walls come down a little faster. That's why they always go to like Fiji on The Bachelor. We talked about our views, goals, and plans - and had everything in common. It was all aligned. But alas, I flew home the next day.



JD: It was a geographic crisis. I think gunning for people who don't live in an accessible vicinity is a sign of unavailability, at least that's what my therapist says. So, though we texted and spoke for months, it was always compartmentalized as a fairy tale for me.

L.O: Does the wistful melody and string arrangement in "House on Fire" reflect your feelings for the crush?

JD: The song is definitively romantic. The lyric on its own is a desperate cry for movement, growth, connection, commitment. I wanted the ball to roll. I wanted it to snowball into an unshakeable love.

L.O: The video is pretty twisted, John.



JD: For me, everything creatively starts with: "you know, I've never seen anyone do _ before" or "I haven't heard a song like in a long time." When I create, it's always an attempt to fill a void. To paint with a palette that isn't currently in use. The "House of Fire" video is a dramatic portrayal of a one-sided relationship. Essentially, this fairy tale guy was something of a prisoner in my mind; perhaps on his own volition, perhaps against his will. But who is the captive and who is the captor? Sure, the fantasy lived in my head but it also consumed me. So, as my production team and I began to treat the video, a lot unfolded and none of it was accidental. The antihero in the video. played by me, is more than meets the eye. To all of his viewers on the internet, he's perfect. He lives in a bright and colorful world and teaches people how to fix things.



teaches people how to fix things. He's pretty. As we began to unpack this whole hostage thing, we realize it's rather omnipresent. We've all kind of become unpaid-employees to the algorithm - and there is no end in sight.

L.O: Are we, the viewers, the doomed girl in the video, captive to social media?

JD: That's sort of how it feels sometimes, right? Like the only way out our current situation is to burn the whole system down. Hmm.

L.O: What are stories that appear on your social newsfeeds?

JD: A ton of Mariah Carey! So many people send me videos and memes of her, because of my first music video, "Girly". I guess that sort of triggered the algorithm into thinking that's all I care about. And to be honest, I don't help. I obviously watch all of the videos.

L.O: The TikTok dance that you do in the video is super catchy! What has been the response from fans?

JD: Ya know, I'm a little bit of a troll, and my longtime followers get that. The people that have responded, love it and they get it. Most of my followers haven't acknowledge it though. They only like me when I'm naked.

L.O: I think we can agree that the fall of social media is inevitable. What are three things you would like to have handy when the house burns down around us all?

JD: My faith in God, water, and music.

L.O: How would you like to be remembered?

JD: As a shiny object. As everyone here is aware, life is tough. So, I hope people recognize the strength and bravery it takes to have fun, to walk tall, and to put yourself out there. If nothing else, I'm great at that.

Through the mentorship of *Chez Damier*, studying behind the desk at Gramaphone Records, and being at the helm of smartbar's wildly successful Queen! party, Garrett David has spent the past decade developing his unmistakable style and ability to hypnotize the dance floor. His meticulous approach and underground attitude shines through his production, releasing lush and skittery tunes on prestigious labels such as Courtesy of Balance, Smallville, Residual, and his own imprint, Global Swing.

Lucy Stoole, Chicago's Black Bearded Beauty, is a Windy City-based drag performer, artist, and activist with an international presence. She's an Out 100 honoree, two-time Drag Queen of the Year, and entrepreneur.

Nico is the anti-socialite party girl that brings shots and chaotic energy to the room, straight from the runway to the punk show. She's rough around the edges with a face that's always blended for the HD.




